The president, secretary-general, deputy secretary-general, and treasurer assume office at the triennial meetings of IAUP, and they serve for three-year terms. At each triennial, the general membership also elects the president-elect, secretary general-elect, and treasurer-elect, who are responsible for organizing the next triennial. The officers of IAUP work closely with the Executive Committee, comprised of the IAUP regional chairs and others appointed by the president, to forward the mission of the organization and meet the needs of the membership.

Introduction of IAUP

The International Association of University Presidents (IAUP), founded in 1964 at Wroxton Abbey, Banbury, England, is an association of university chief executive officers – presidents, rectors, vice chancellors, and chancellors – from higher education institutions around the world. It is a recognized charity (non-profit) in the United Kingdom.

IAUP is free of political and partisan interests. Its primary purpose is to strengthen the international mission and quality of higher education around the world. IAUP offers a regular forum for higher education leaders and institutions to identify and discuss in a global and cross-cultural context the major issues and challenges facing higher education today. It is also an association committed to serving its members and the institutions they lead.



Purposes

- To provide a worldwide vision of higher education.
- To strengthen the international mission of institutions throughout the world.
- To promote academic exchange and collaboration.
- To make every effort so that the voice of educational leaders is heard.
- To promote networking and collaboration between leaders of universities, supporting sustainable development in a context of global competency.
- To promote peace and international understanding through education.



IAUP Regional Councils

IAUP relies on the dedication and commitment of its member presidents for its relevance and success. Prominent amongst the membership are the chairs of our Regional Councils, all of whom also serve on the IAUP Executive Committee. Working closely with the IAUP Secretary General, and under the leadership of the IAUP President, they volunteer to provide leadership, representing IAUP in their home region. These distinguished educators engage college rectors, vice chancellors, chancellors and presidents in their part of the world in service to the mission and purposes of IAUP as *The Global Voice of Higher Education*. Members are encouraged to participate actively in the activities of their region, which may include regional meetings, affiliation with regional professional organizations and taking a leadership role in the region as advocates of quality and accessible higher education.



Activities and Benefits

IAUP Semi-Annual Meetings

The IAUP meets twice each year in international locations of cultural and historical interest. These gatherings include meetings of the IAUP Executive Committee (which all IAUP members may attend as observers), meetings of IAUP special interest groups, commissions, and taskforces (which all IAUP members may attend as participants), and the IAUP Council of Senior Advisors. This means that through IAUP you will have regular opportunities to interact, network, and develop partnerships with peers from higher education institutions around the world. Meetings for the 2011-2014 presidency are scheduled for Vienna, Austria, Bogota, Colombia, Tbilisi, Georgia, Guadalajara, Mexico, and Xinzheng City, Henan, PRC.

IAUP/Microsoft Academic Summit Initiative

The IAUP is partnering with Microsoft Partners in Learning to create and offer seminars around the world focusing on current technology as a driver to move forward the strategic objectives of individual universities. These seminars are tailored to the particular needs and interests of universities in different regions of the world. This means that member-presidents and members of their senior leadership teams can make more informed decisions about the adaptation of existing technologies and the implementation of new technologies for innovative teaching, research and administration.

IAUP/UN Commission on Disarmament Education, Conflict Resolution and Peace

IAUP is the only external organization to manage a joint commission with the United Nations. Commission delegates are appointed by IAUP's International President, in consultation with the commission co-chairs. IAUP was instrumental in creating the Year of Peace at the UN and is recognized annually at the UN Day of Peace activities. The commission works with UN offices dedicated to peace, disarmament, and conflict resolution issues in order to further the objectives of these offices. The commission also furthers the goals of the IIE Scholar Rescue Fund (<http://www.scholarrescuefund.org>), which works to secure placements for scholars at risk at universities around the world. Joining IAUP means you and key faculty or staff members at your institution have the opportunity to be appointed to this rare, high-level commission.

IAUP/CAEL 21st Century Skills Commission

The IAUP is partnering with the Council for Adult and Experiential Learning (CAEL) to develop an action-oriented agenda that will ensure that learners, of any age, graduate with the insights, skills and abilities necessary for meaningful, productive employment; advance a worldwide degree completion agenda, encouraging all nations to increase the number of those seeking and earning a baccalaureate degree as a commitment to creating an educated and skilled workforce; advance recognition of university-level learning acquired outside the traditional classroom for credit towards post-secondary degree attainment; and encourage use and acceptance of life learning portfolios as a vehicle to document and affirm meaningful skills and learning acquired at any point across an individual's life path. This means that member-presidents and their institutions can help define the skills, knowledge and abilities university graduates will need to be successful.

UN Academic Impact

IAUP is the lead partner organization with the United Nations in creating its Academic Impact initiative [<http://academicimpact.org>]. Leadership opportunities continue to exist for IAUP members in managing this global initiative of educational institutions. This means you and key faculty and staff members at your institution have the opportunity to take a leadership role in working with the United Nations Department of Public Information in shaping the initiative and promoting its goals.

WISE Education Leadership Programme

Sponsored by the Qatar Foundation and co-managed by IAUP and IIE, in partnership with the Association of Commonwealth Universities (ACU) and the Agence Universitaire de la Francophonie (AUF), this annual leadership program trains new university presidents around the world in management strategies for leading their institutions. This means that you have the opportunity to participate in the development and teaching of the training modules for new university presidents and develop personal relationships with them.

International Education Faculty Achievement Award

Each year IAUP recognizes faculty who make significant contributions in curriculum development for world citizenship

and who prepare students for successful careers in our global economy. Each member president of IAUP may annually nominate one faculty member from his or her university for a certificate of acknowledgement that is signed by IAUP's President and the member university president making the nomination. This means that you have the opportunity to recognize with a prestigious award from a distinguished international association those conscientious faculty who are making a difference at your university.

ACADEME: Journal of Leadership and Management in Higher Education

UNESCO Interaction

IAUP is an accredited NGO with the UN Educational, Social and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) in Paris, which is the premier educational and cultural organization within the United Nations system. This means that you have the opportunity to participate in activities of the Division of Higher Education (World Conferences on H.E., Seminars and the UNESCO Unitwin and Chairs Programs) and present proposals for funding, through the Participation Program of UNESCO, especially to assist higher education in developing countries.

High-Level Representation to the United Nations

IAUP is a non-governmental organization holding consultative status with the United Nations through the UN Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC). With that distinction, member-presidents are eligible to attend high-level conferences and events at UN Headquarters in New York, Geneva, and Vienna, and may be called upon by the IAUP's International President to represent the organization at policy- and agenda-setting meetings within the UN system. Member-presidents may also be designated to submit written and oral statements on higher education. This means that IAUP members have the opportunity to represent an international civil society organization on the global stage.

Academic Chairs for Africa

This IAUP initiative aims to create and fund 1,000 chairs to be occupied at universities in Africa as a realistic and substantive, albeit partial, solution to Africa's complex higher education needs. Academic Chairs for Africa has received support from many individuals and associations such as the United Nations, UNESCO, the World Bank and the African Development Bank. This means that you have an opportunity to work with IAUP to advance this important project.

Membership in CoNGO

IAUP is a full member of the Conference of Non-Governmental Organizations in Consultative Relations with the United Nations (CoNGO). With this distinction, IAUP's International President may appoint member-presidents to committees within the UN NGO system, including committees based in New York, Geneva and Vienna. Examples include the Committee on the Status of Women, the Committee on HIV/AIDS, the Committee on Sustainable Development, the Committee on Narcotics & Substance Abuse, the Committee on Human Rights, and the Committee on Finance for Development. This means you have the opportunity to review the array of UN initiatives and be nominated as a delegate to work on policy committees or commissions that interest you, either personally or from an institutional perspective.

IAUP Leadership Positions

There are on-going opportunities for member-presidents to serve in leadership roles as members of the IAUP Executive Committee, regional chair, or task force members. This means that you have the opportunity to provide leadership and direction to an international association that holds the highest accreditations with many of the most distinguished organizations working for improving higher education worldwide. IAUP is the Global Voice of Higher Education, and the IAUP leadership has the ability to channel that voice and serve as its spokesperson.

Presidential Updates

IAUP members receive periodic updates on issues and forums of interest to chief executive officers in higher education. This means you have access to a global online network of peers. IAUP offers members access to its network for information that is comprehensive and of clear interest to the chief executive officers of higher education.



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Council of Senior Advisors

The Council of Senior Advisors is a group of distinguished leaders from government, business and education who have made significant contributions to the causes for which IAUP stands. Council members provide advice to IAUP on the association's strategic agenda, assist with specific IAUP commissions, and provide both economic and human resources to the association.

Held regularly under the leadership of the various regional and national councils of IAUP, these conferences focus on regional issues in higher education. They are open to all members of IAUP and, together, represent one of the major activities of the organization.



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Membership

Membership in IAUP is strictly limited to the chief executive officer of each university—president, rector, vice chancellor, chancellor or founder. Membership dues are \$700 (USD) per year or \$1,890 for a three-year period. Former chief executive officers may join at half price or request a lifetime membership with a one-time payment of \$2,000 (USD).
